Each week, we're introducing a specific focus to help our children develop important social skills and respect for one another. Following our half-term work on corridor movement and doorway etiquette, this week we've been encouraging children to knock and ask politely when entering rooms. I'm delighted to report that our children are embracing these expectations with pride and enthusiasm.

Our drop-in session with the school nurse on Wednesday was well attended. These monthly sessions provide a valuable opportunity for parents to discuss any concerns about their child's health and wellbeing. We'll continue to share the dates for these sessions on Dojo and in our newsletters.

I'm thrilled to celebrate our boys' football team's recent success. They played against Peel Park on Thursday night in a challenging match, ultimately securing a fantastic 3-1 victory. It was wonderful to arrange a game with a local school we haven't previously played, and we're already looking forward to hosting a return fixture. Thank you to Mrs Burrow for working hard to prepare the team for these events. Looking ahead, we have two important events next week. On Tuesday, we'll be observing Remembrance Day. The children will participate in a special assembly and attend a service at the war graves adjacent to our school, helping them understand the significance of this important day of remembrance.

On Friday, we'll be supporting Children in Need. We're hosting a non-uniform day with a voluntary £1 contribution to support this fantastic cause. It's a great opportunity for our children to have fun while raising money for an important charity.
